We meet in the name of God:

The Confession

Let us now call to mind our sin and the infinite mercy of God.

Make our hearts clean, O God;

The Imposition of Ashes

We are all invited to sign ourselves with the cross in ash on our foreheads (use ash if you have it or just use your thumb)

When everyone has been marked with the ash, we pray:

You have given all to me;

All to you, Lord, I return it.

Everything is yours;

All do with it what you will.

Give me only your love and your grace;

All that is enough for me.

God our Father, the strength of all who put their trust in you, mercifully accept our prayers; and because, in our weakness, we can do nothing good without you, grant us the help of your grace, that in keeping your commandments we may please you, both in will and deed; through Jesus Christ our Lord.
